2023 Holy Spirit Food Ministry Report

Your Food Ministry volunteers have been hard at work this past year in being able to feed needy families in our community. The following is a brief run down of the families fed.

We estimate that we helped feed about 3,525 individuals.

Total food boxes delivered were 859 boxes.

Estimated pounds of food delivered was 27,570 pounds.

Estimated volunteer man hours were 3,281 hours.

We could not have accomplished this without the generous donations we received. We pray for continued support for this ministry. We have experienced rising costs almost monthly.

We are always looking for new volunteers to help us out if only a few hours here and there. Come by the church Friday mornings about 9:30 am to witness how we do things.

We would like to wish everyone a healthy and blessed year.

For all of those who participated in our Christmas Angel Tree gift program, thank you so much. Because of your generosity, you helped make 29 children in our community, and 21 residents of a local Nursing Home have a brighter Christmas.

Patristic Evidence - Liturgical Holy Kiss

St. Justin Martyr, the first to mention the Holy Kiss in terms of the synapse of the Christians, tells us that it was exchanged at the end of the prayers. Justin Martyr, First Apology *"Having ended the prayers, we salute one another with a kiss. There is then brought to the president of the brethren bread and a cup of wine..."* (First Apology, 65). In the *Apostolic Tradition* of Hippolytus, men did not kiss women, and the catechumens did not exchange the Kiss. *'After the catechumens have finished praying, they do not give the kiss of peace, for their kiss is not yet pure. But the faithful shall greet one another with a kiss, men with men, and women with women. Men must not greet women with a kiss.'* The Apostolic Constitutions (380) informs us that the deacon announced the holy kiss after prayers of the faithful, the clergy then kiss each other, then the laymen kiss the other men, and the women kiss the women. Tertullian (155-240 AD) was the first to use the term "kiss of peace". He wrote of the liturgical kiss as the *"signaculum orationis"*; a seal or consummation set on prayers. *"What prayer is complete when divorced from the Holy Kiss?"* St. Cyril of Jerusalem included the kiss in the liturgy of Good Friday as the manner to reverence the True Cross in the Church of the Holy Sepulcher.

Some of the Church Fathers read John 20:22 as a kiss from Jesus to the apostles gathered in the Upper Room after the Resurrection. St. Augustine declares that when Jesus 'breathed on them', it can be read as a holy kiss of peace. Just as the Father kissed Adam in Gen 2:7, with that first breath, so also Jesus breathed new life into the assembled disciples.

After his resurrection, when he first appeared to his disciples, he said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit." About this giving then, it was said, "The Spirit had not yet been given because Jesus had not yet been glorified." "And he breathed upon their face." The One who first gave life to man by breathing and raised him up from the mire and by breathing gave a soul to his members is the same One who breathed upon their face that they might rise up from the slime and renounce filthy works. (Sermon 32,6)
