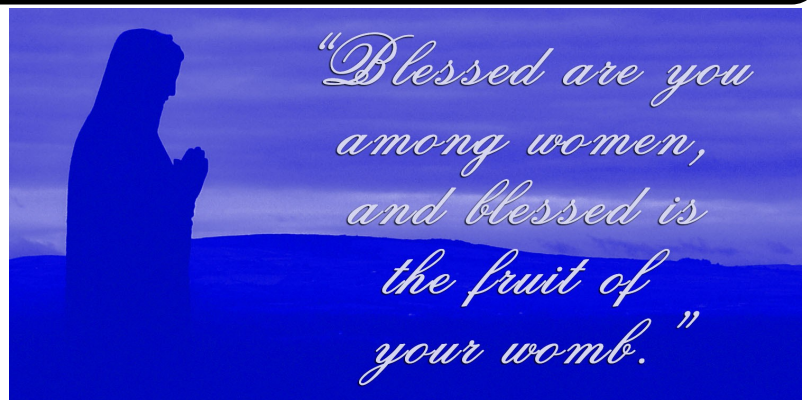

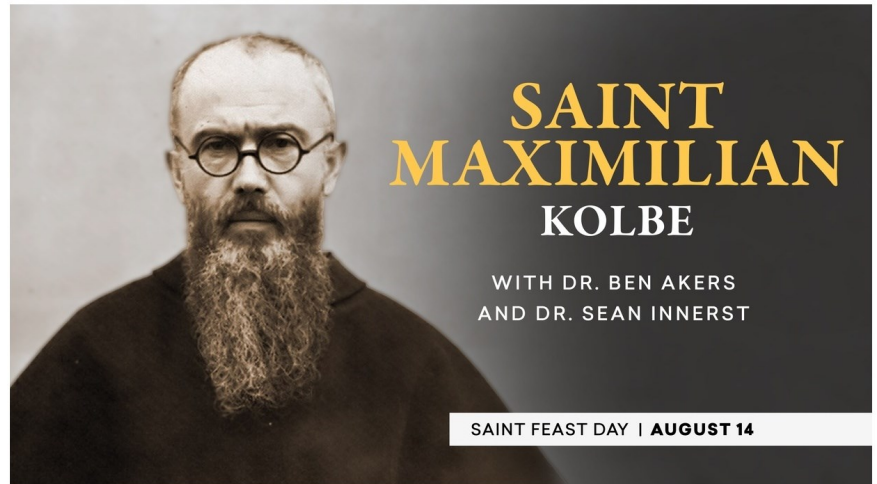

Special Observances

Monday: St. Jane Frances de Chantal, Religious (*Wife of Baron de Chantal and mother of 6; as a widow, she and St. Francis de Sales, her spiritual director, founded in 1610 at Annecy in Savoy the Visitation nuns; established 85 monasteries.*)

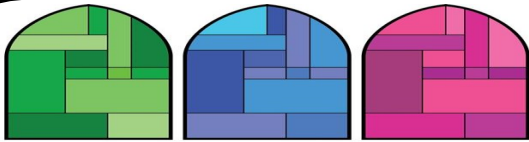
Tuesday: St. Pontian, Pope, Martyr (*Bishop of Rome banished by Maximianus Thrax to Sardinia where he was reconciled with Hippolytus; before dying, he abdicated his office—first pope to do so—to make way for his successor, St. Anterus.*)

Hippolytus, Priest, Martyr (*Disputed author of "Apostolic Tradition"; Roman priest and stern rigorist; opposed Sabellianism and milder penitential discipline of Pope St. Callistus; first anti-pope; exiled to Sardinia with Pontian; source of Eucharistic Prayer II.*)

Wednesday: St. Maximilian Kolbe, Priest, Martyr (*Born in Poland and died in Auschwitz by lethal injection; founded Militia of Mary Immaculate; missioned in Japan; offered his life in exchange for the father of a family.*)

Thursday: The Assumption of the Blessed Mary (*The "Natale of Dormitio" which is the "Falling—asleep" of Mary came to be celebrated as early as the 5th century in the East and in Rome; patroness of France, Paraguay, Jamaica, South Africa, and New Caledonia.*)

Friday: St. Stephen of Hungary (*First Christian kin of Hungary who united and Christianized the Magyar people; received "holy crown" from Pope Sylvester II; renowned for his charity to beggars; known as the "Apostolic King" and "Apostle of Hungary".*)

EUCCHARISTIC REVIVAL IN TYLER

The internationally-acclaimed **Eucharist Miracles** exhibit compiled by Blessed Carlo Acutis goes on display Friday, August 16 and continues through Sunday afternoon. Opening ceremony on Friday evening will include a procession of the relic at 5:30, followed by Candlelight Rosary and Adoration at 7:00 in the Cathedral.

The first-class relic of Blessed Carlos is one of the few in the US, and it will be present in the exhibit for veneration on Friday and Saturday only. Carlo's canonization was approved last month—he died at the age of 15, having lived a holy, active, generous life that was a light to all who met him.

On Saturday evening, an event especially for our youth will be led by Michael Edwards, founder of the Carlo Acutis Apostolate. The **Eucharistic Youth Rally** begins at 6:30 at the St. Gregory School, Broadway entrance, just south of the Cathedral. Parents and families are also welcome. Bring snacks, if your choose. Rally ends at 8:00.

1. Short History

After the consecration of the world to the Most Sweet and Motherly Heart of Mary in 1942, many petitions were sent to the Roman Pontiff asking him to extend to the whole Church the Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary that already existed in some places. Pius XII agreed in 1945 certain to find in her most loving Heart... the safe haven in the midst of the tempest that everywhere assails us. Through the symbol of her heart we venerate in Mary her most pure and perfect love for God and her motherly love for each one of us. In that heart of hers we can find a refuge in the midst of all the difficulties and temptations of life, and we ask her to prepare for us the safe way – iter para tutum – the way by which we will soon reach her Son.

2. The Heart of Mary: Qualities

My head rejoices in your saving power. I will sing to the Lord for his goodness to me (Entrance Antiphon, Mass of the Immaculate Heart of Mary) ...

In the Gospels, the first time the Heart of Mary is mentioned is to express all the richness of Our Lady's interior life. Saint Luke writes: Mary kept all these things, pondering them in her heart (Luke 2:19).

The Preface of the Mass attributes a number of qualities to the Heart of Mary.

It is wise, because she understood the meaning of the Scriptures as no other person had ever done, and she kept in it the memory of the words and things relating to the mystery of salvation.

It is immaculate, that is, immune from any stain of sin, it is docile because she submitted so faithfully to God's Will and to every one of his wishes.

It is new, according to the ancient prophecy of Ezechiel – a new heart I will give you, and a new spirit (cf Ezek 36:26) – clothed in the newness of grace merited by Christ.

It is humble because she imitated the humility of Christ, who said Learn from me; for I am gentle and lowly in heart (Mark 11:29).

It is simple, free from any duplicity and full of the Spirit of truth.

It is clean and thus able to see God according to the words of the Beatitude (cf Matt 5:8).

It is firm in her acceptance of the Will of God when Simeon announced to her that a sword of sorrow would pierce her heart (cf Luke 2:35), when persecution broke out against her Son (cf Matt 2:13) or when the moment of his death was at hand. It is ready, for whilst Christ slept in the sepulcher she kept watch in the expectation of his resurrection, just like the spouse in the Canticle of Canticles (cf Cant 5:2).

The Immaculate Heart of Mary is called, above all, the temple of the Holy Spirit (cf Second Vatican Council, Lumen gentium, 53), by reason of her divine motherhood and because of the continuous and all-embracing inhabitation of the Holy Spirit in her soul. This sublime maternity that places Mary above all other created beings, was accomplished in her Immaculate Heart before it was accomplished in her most pure womb. The Fathers affirm that she conceived the Word to whom she gave birth according to the flesh first of all in her heart according to faith (cf St Augustine, On Holy Virginity, 3). By her Immaculate Heart, full of faith and love, a heart that was humble and totally dedicated to the Will of God, Mary merited to carry the Son of God in her virginal womb. She always protects us as a mother protects her small child who is everywhere surrounded by dangers and difficulties, and helps us to grow continuously. How can we possibly prevent ourselves turning to her each day? ...
